The Horticulture project that has been in development since 2012 is finally underway. The ECT transport project has been providing free group travel for youth clubs, churches and schools in the area.

Hanwell Community Centre Consortium is established as a charitable company and Young people have been doing great activities at the holiday Schemes and youth clubs across the area. New this year, 24 young people will be mentored by 12 volunteers under the Make It scheme.

The Partnership is growing and is now represented by members of High Lane and Gurnell Grove estates as well as Cuckoo and Copley Close, St Christopher's church and Ealing CVS.

Our new look improved website is on its way and we hope that everybody will start to promote their events, services and activities there.

Local Residents' Associations

High Lane Residents Association (HLRA)

High Lane Residents Association (HLRA) was set up to aid the residents who reside on the estate which covers Hanway and Hobbayne Roads in Hanwell.

The HLRA work closely with the council liaison team and are committed to running the association to meet the needs of a very diverse population. The association endeavours to be inclusive and have set up some initiatives that run on a regular schedule to meet the needs of youth, young families /mothers and adults. These endeavours include:

- Youth club
- Stay and Play
- Coffee mornings (a variety of information and sometimes guests are invited to talk to residents about local issues)
- Funding permitting there are also a number of community days planned for example Family Summer Fun Day, Christmas Lunch for pensioners, Children's Spring Party, and in the past a Jubilee Street Party
- In conjunction with the council the committee fought for funding to erect a multi games arena (MUGA) to cater for recreation for all youths and children who live on the estate and the council have provided extra play areas across the estate in conjunction with resident's needs, utilising free space on the estate.

Copley Close Steering Group

Copley Close Steering Group was set up to ensure that residents' views about the forthcoming regeneration were taken into account. Over the last 6 years, the residents have been involved in deciding the design of the estate, having a say in who the contractors are and making sure that the council and its contractors are held to account. This year the aim is to ensure that residents' voices are really heard, with empowerment and enhancement of skillsets to make sure that Copley Close truly becomes a great place to live.

Gurnell Residents Association

Gurnell residents association has been running almost a year with a new committee. The estate comprises of 3 blocks and 3 blocks of maisonettes along side Housing association new builds around the estate.

The estate is built around a large green grassed area with a newly refurbished under 7s playground next to a 5 a side football/basketball area for the older children/teenagers.

Many of our older residents have lived on the estate since it was built back in the 1960s.

The four committee members come from 4 different nationality's which covers our estate so can work together to reach out to our residents. We have recently started an over 50s club and one of our residents is organizing a Fun Day in July. We are working on some ideas to help the future of our estate.

Cuckoo Estate

The Cuckoo Estate in Hanwell is a large inter-war estate of small houses on and around Cuckoo Avenue, a beautiful chestnuts-lined boulevard. It was built by the London County Council between 1933 and 1939 on the land that was originally part of a Victorian Poor Law school that closed in 1932.

Green Hanwell

We are very excited to announce that due to the support for the Spacehive campaign which attracted £65000, funding from Copley Regeneration and LBE Housing of £68000 and £10000 from the Cleveland Ward Forum we are now have the beginnings of an innovative and life-changing project for everybody across the whole area.

The recruitment for the two apprenticeships is now complete and initial work on the woodland has already taken place. We have a plan of action for the next three years:

- a. Developing the Conservation Woodland area into an accessible outdoor wildlife classroom
- b. Food Growing project on Copley Close
- c. Food growing project on High Lane
- d. Hanwell Community Centre Memorial Garden revival
- e. Orchard trail across the whole area and hopefully including
- f. Food growing/ community garden project on Gurnell Grove (to be decided by residents)

The HBL small grants scheme has secured a set of tools for the resident volunteer team and Copley Housing have provided us with a secure shed for storage. Now all we need is for you to get involved! How?

Hanwell Community Centre Consortium

The Hanwell Community Centre (HCC), situated at the top of Cuckoo Avenue in the heart of the Big Local area, is a very important community resource, an important landmark, and a local heritage asset.

It is owned and presently managed by Ealing Council. The Council are committed to handing over the management of HCC to an outside body, and the first step in inviting bids is expected to be taken soon.

The Hanwell Big Local Partners are keen that the building continues to providing



community benefits: that the potential of the building and the park are maximised, and that the future management and running of the building and the park will be by local people and be responsive to local needs. We have supported the formation of a new Company, run by local people - **Hanwell Community Centre Consortium**, which is in the process of becoming a registered charity. The company is now trained, funded and structured to respond to the first stage of the Council's tender

Transport

In Partnership with Ealing Community Transport



1. PlusBus Individual Transport

PlusBus is a door-to-door bus service for Hanwell Big Local area residents' who cannot use, or have difficulty using, public transport (for example, because of age, disability or long term illness). First 5 trips will be free. Future trips will be at the subsidised return fare of £2. Each one-way journey costs £1. Children travelling with a parent and carers will travel free on all journeys.

2. Group Transport

HBL Group Transport service in Partnership with ECT can provide minibuses for any groups from voluntary or community organisations, Schools, clubs and neighbourhood associations based in the Hanwell Big Local. This service is available **FREE** of charge.

3. Training Hanwell Big Local Residents

HBL in Partnership with ECT offer various training packages and short work experiences for Hanwell Big Local residents, including:

- 1. Certificated MiDAS training for wheelchair-user accessible minibuses
- 2. Manual handling training
- 3. Safeguarding training
- 4. 5 days of unpaid work experience with an experienced driver or PA.



Any Hanwell resident who wishes to undergo driver training or PA training must be at least 21 years of age and hold a valid D1 driving licence. All training is free of charge to Hanwell big Local residents.

EASE

Youth Activities and Holiday Schemes

The Hanwell Big Local has funded **EASE** to run schemes at Hanwell Community Centre and other locations. These have been very popular, always fully booked and well attended with waiting lists.

Activities included for the 8-12 years old were T shirt design, Cooking, Basketball, dance, Origami, Arts and

Crafts, Boxing, Photography and Tennis. Activities included for the 5 - 7 years old were Cooking, Art & Craft, Sewing, Gardening project, Treasure Hunt, Tie & dye, Making bird feeder, Sport, Easter Egg Hunt and Easter project competition and Team Games

This coming summer holidays there will be a holiday scheme for children 5-12 years old at Hanwell Community Centre.



Youth Mentoring Scheme HBL in Partnership with E.A.S.E.

The Mentoring Project supports young people who face multiple challenges varying from inclusion in school, confidence, clear boundaries, transition periods etc. We aim to provide 1:1 volunteer mentors to support up to 24 vulnerable young people aged 11-17 who live within the Hanwell Big Local Area. The mentors will be hand-picked for each young person and they commit to a 6 month relationship, supporting and journeying with their mentee.

Hathaway Primary School After-School Clubs

London Pulse have been delivering Basketball at Hathaway 3 times a week during lunchtimes for Years 3-6. They have had approximately 30 children attended each session, however some days they have more children attend. Teachers have said that the children are more focused, less disruptive and more occupied at lunchtimes. All the staff at Hathaway are really thankful that Hanwell Big Local have given the school funding so that our pupils have the chance to participate in other sporting activities.

Most of the children said they felt a little worried at the start but now are more confident when participating. The all felt that their health/fitness had improved, they had learnt some new skills and they enjoyed playing with other pupils.

Our Bigger story

HBL has been selected as one of the 15 participating areas in Our Bigger Story, the multi-media evaluation of Big Local. From 150, 15 Local areas were selected to participation in the evaluation. The evaluation aims to capture that change, and the learning involved, for individuals, families, Big Local partnerships and the wider community. It will do so by supporting local residents to develop a range of multi-media resources which follow Big Local journeys for up to ten years and by producing a series of films, written and other materials which illustrate progress towards Big Local outcomes. The evaluation 'products' will also be useful to a wider audience of practitioners and community activists, policy makers and funders.
