# What is Hanwell Big Local?

It is a 10-year (2015-2024) community project covering the Cuckoo, Gurnell, High Lane and Copley estates and surrounding roads. It's led by the HBL Partnership but it belongs to ALL the residents in these areas.

Hanwell Big Local has £1 million of Big Lottery funding over the 10-year period to make a massive and lasting positive difference to our community. 2019 is Year 5 of the 10-year project See our website for more information about how this project will benefit you, your family and the community, how you can contribute and get involved.

#### **High Lane**

The council has been engaged with residents of High Lane regarding the possibility of estate regeneration since 2013. Should the works go ahead the regeneration is likely to commence towards the end of 2022 with a view to completion of phase 3 (final phase) about 6 to 7 years later.

I have been a member of HBL for about 12 months. The enthusiasm and commitment of members is inspiring. As a group we are always looking to raise the bar to provide meaningful projects and activities within the community.

This includes self-help groups, small grants and providing activities where residents can learn new skills. # Getting around in Hanwell



Is your group or organisation based within the Hanwell Big Local area?

Would your group would like to organise a trip such as a visit to a theatre or the seaside? If the only thing stopping you is a lack of transport then Hanwell Big Local can subsidise your trip.

In 2019, Hanwell Big Local will continue to work with Ealing Community Transport (ECT) in offering subsidised transport services for community groups in the Hanwell Big Local area. Your group pays a reduced fee.

#### **Plus Bus Individual Transport**

PlusBus is a door-to-door bus service for Hanwell Big Local area residents who cannot use, or have difficulty using, public transport (because of age, disability or long term illness for example). First 5 trips are free. Future trips will be at the subsidised return fare of £2. Each one-way journey costs £1.



#### Copley

The Copley Residents' Association (RA) was formed in June 2018 to represent the interests of all Copley residents. It aims to ensure that the views of Copley residents are properly considered by Ealing Council in any decisions made in relation to the Copley Estate.

The main priority of the RA is to bring the local community together by promoting effective resident engagement on Copley Estate. This was evidenced by the successful Estate Fun Day hosted by the RA on Saturday 8 September 2018, which was attended by more than 200 residents, children and young people.

The Copley Residents' Steering Group (RSG), a sub-group of the RA, ensures that the views and interests of all Copley residents are considered by the Council when making decisions in relation to the regeneration of the Estate. The RSG meets with the Council on a regular basis and ensures that residents are kept updated on the regeneration process.

The Council recently nominated the RSG for a (Recognising Outstanding Achievements of Residents) R.O.A.R. Award in recognition of the work of the RSG in the regeneration project.

#### What can I apply for?

Hanwell Big Local (HBL) Small Grants are for small groups or residents to run an activity or to supply equipment that enables activities, where HBL can be publicised. For example:

- Have a barbecue for your block
- A coffee morning
- Gardening tools to help to maintain your block's communal garden
- Run an activity at a school fete or a community fun day
- Help to buy a team strip for a football or netball team
- Summer activity for families

# The Hanwell Big Local Horticulture Project: Green Hanwell

Since its launch 4 years ago a huge amount of work has been done to improve the green spaces around Hanwell.

We are pleased to announce that the Hammersmith Community Gardens
Association is bringing its 35 years of experience to Hanwell to help with the Big Local Horticulture Project.

Much is known about the health benefits of gardening, we want to add this to the benefits of meeting and working with other members of our community to help make even better greener spaces and give people the chance to have access to fresh fruits and vegetables grown in our community gardens.


All our community gardening sessions will give people the time and space to have a chat over a cup of tea whilst helping make a better environment.

Every third Tuesday of the month there will be a free workshop at the Hanwell Community Centre 4-6pm where all are welcome to get involved in a fun gardening or environment-based activity.



The first Saturday of each month will be a Community Gardening Day in one of the three main gardens we will be concentrating on this year - Paddington Court, the Gurnell Grove Gardens and Copley Wood woodland. The first of these will be Saturday 6th April (10am - 1pm) with a herb planting session at Paddington Court. We will have the smoothie bike out for the children, whilst people join in planting fresh herbs in all the planters and even take home a pot of herbs to put on your own windowsill. Please bring your favourite recipe for cooking with fresh herbs to share.

Gurnell Grove Gardens have some wonderful well stocked beds and raised planters. There will be a weekday community gardening group starting there on the **second Tuesday of the month** starting on the 12th March, 10am – 1pm. We will maintain and improve the gardens in Gurnell Grove and will sow seeds and take cuttings that can be used in other gardens in the area. Come along to learn some new horticultural skills or share your own knowledge, or just have a laugh and meet new people whilst helping tidy-up the site.

#### **Youth Mentoring**

#### Gang Prevention Workshop / Motivational Speaking

EASE provides gang prevention workshops and motivational speaking during our youth club sessions to inform young people about their youth rights, teach them basic first aid skills, how to manage money in the future, and awareness of gangs and how to keep themselves safe. This is the second year of running these after an extremely successful first year.
